

Like and Would like (Speaking and grammar)

- Description:** Partners take turns asking questions and choosing the appropriate response from a list.
- Use with or after:** *English Network 1 New Edition*, Unit 6, Step 1
- Skill:** Speaking and grammar.
- Focus:** Questions and answers, mainly with *like* and *would like*.
- Time:** 10 minutes
- Preparation:**
- Print out the three pages of this file.
 - Make enough copies of the second and third pages (worksheets for partners A and B) so that each student can have one of the worksheets, but not both.
- Procedure:**
- Write on the board: *Take turns*. See if anyone can explain what it means or at least give the German equivalent: *Sich abwechseln*.
 - Divide the class into two groups, A and B, on opposite sides of the room.
 - Give each student the appropriate worksheet for his or her group.
 - Two or three students from the same group read through their worksheet together and help each other understand what they are supposed to do.
 - You might want to explain that both groups have the same list of possible responses at the bottom of their worksheets. It is possible that a response might be used more than once, or not at all.
 - The students stand up, find a partner from the other group and follow the instructions on their worksheets. You should monitor in case of difficulties, and insist that they do not look at each other's worksheets, only at their own.
 - When they are finished, ask the class which items are *offers* (2, 9 and 10) and which are *general questions* (all the others). If there is any uncertainty about this, refer them to the box under the menu on page 89 of *English Network 1 New Edition*, and to exercise 3b on the same page

Partner A

Find a partner from the other group. Please do not look at your partner's worksheet, only at your own!
